

The "CUT" for Sunday's finals were the top 18 skaters, which included two Amateurs.

Mickey Alba, Eddie Elguera, and (AM) Steve Hirsch were the top three after SATURDAY.

"Doubles" qualifying followed immediately after.

Duane Peters/Eddie Elguera; David Andrecht/George Orton; and Eric Grisham/ Steve Hirsch made up the top three spots.

This event saw alot of collisions between the skaters.

Bobby Valdez dislocated his shoulder when he collided with partner Daryl Miller on their first run.

After witnessing this rather serious injury and several other minor ones, I was not surprised to see several other teams pull out of the event. The ALVA/OLSON team and DUNLAP/BOWMAN were two

of several teams that did not compete.

The fact of the matter was that these pools were pretty tough to skate, with alot of "vert", so if you did not have your act together and your routines well planned, you just did not belong in this event.

The days of just getting together with someone and working out a routine in the spur of the moment are over, you better know what your partner is going to do and spend plenty of time working it out, if you hope to place high. Whew! competition is real touch in this event.

As the day ended and Saturday's skating was completed, there was talk of some good food and much needed rest.

SUNDAY

Sunday night brought together the PRO-finalists, in a grueling elimination process that took 3hrs. to complete.

18 finalists would skate in four(4) preliminary Heats.

HEAT 1 consisted of Peter (KIWI) Gifford, SIMS' Bert LaMar, SIMS' Brad Bowman and Upland's very own Steve Alba.

HEAT 2 had Eric Halverson (HAUT), Series V winner at Whittier Duane Peters(DT), HOBIE's "El Gato" Eddie Elguera and Mr. "O" himself, George Orton(VARIFLEX).

HEAT 3 consisted of Daryl Miller, Steve Olson (SANTA CRUZ-INDY), Mickey Alba (KRY PTONICS) and VARIFLEX's super Amateur Steve Hirsch.

HEAT 4 saw David "Raver"
Andrecht(SIMS), Doug "pineapple" Saladino(G & S), Eric Grisham(VARIFLEX), Ray"Bones" Rodriguez(POWELL) and G & S's Craig Rowe.

Only 8 skaters would qualify from the above Heats to compete in the Semi-Finals.

The order of qualifying was as follows: 1st was Steve Alba; 2nd Eric Grisham; 3rd Mickey Alba and 4th Dave Andrecht.

The Amateur who skated all day on both days was "iron man" Steve Hirsch(VARIFLEX) he took 5th. 6th went to Eddie Elguera(HOBIE), his runs were highlighted by his now famous "Elguerio" and very delayed foot plants.

A crowd pleasing trick by Ray Rodriguez, a double-tap rock n' roll on the hip of the pool earned him 7th.

Eighth place went to Duane Peters who had some very clean "rock-walk-reverts"

FINAL

The four(4) Finalists, Andrecht, both Alba boys and Grisham had the crowd standing up, cheering for each skater.

Every maneuver that each skater made seemed to feed the crowd, but it did not satisfy them. The level of excitement kept on rising, demanding more and more of each skater.

This high pitch of spectator involvement alone, made the event a dramatic success.

With every turn, you could just feel the pressure on each skater to better his last run.

The quality of skating has not been better and every one knew it.

An example of this was when Eric Grisham(VARIFLEX) was having an incredible 2nd run and then managed to pull off an "extreme" BIO-INVERT. The crowd went crazy and Eric knew he had won first(1st) place and all the marbles, \$1,000.!!!

Battling it out for 2nd place were Dave Andrecht & Steve Alba. Both were performing to their best of their abilities.

It was apparent that Steve Alba had been practicing. His routine consisted of successfully using the entire pool, shallow end and all. Unfortunately, Steve suffered a series of falls that penalized him to 3rd place. Dave Andrecht brought the spectators to their feet with his "BIO Axle drops" and a variety of successfull maneuvers. This earned him 2nd.and \$500. \$250. went to Steve Alba.

Fourth place went to Mickey Alba(\$125.) Mickey pulled off a series of Bio maneuvers

that had the crowd going & not to mention his "milelong board slides". Mickey also had a few rare falls but continued to skate in form.

It should be mentioned that Mickey did win the "OVERALL SERIES" with top points earned in all the events. He walked away with \$500. for the Series win, a Kryptonics Surfboard, the "Official" HESTER Series banner and a plaque for his efforts.

In other words, "he Scored"!

DOUBLES FINALS

The winning doubles team was again Eric Grisham/ Steve Hirsch(VARIFLEX) As they had done in Whittier, they were the superior team.

Their routine was very innovative. They used both pools and it was obvious that they had all their maneuvers "wired".

Footplants by Eric onto Steve board stall and Steve's rock n' roll over Eric's boardstall were examples of originality in their routine. Other tricks such as, cross overs and yes, not to mention a casual hand-shake at the end of their routine, pleased the crowd and got them First place and \$300.

The Elguera/ Duane Peters team, also performed very clean. Consecutive inverts, backside airs by Peters, while Eddie carved under, Elgerios and crossovers highlighted their routine and earned them Second and \$200.

THIS HAD BEEN A LONG WEEKEND for Henry and the Hoffmans, with both Amateur and PRO events.

They all must be complimented because we failed to hear one single complaint about the running of the competition.
