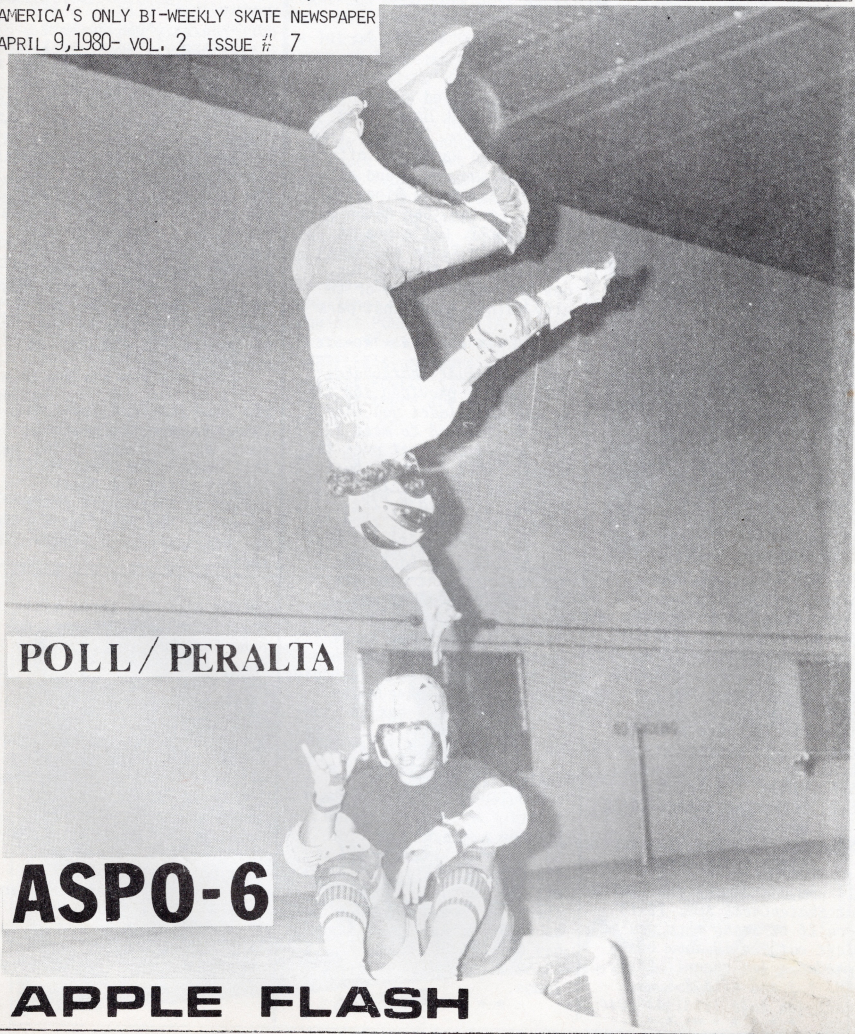

SKATEBOARDER POLL AWARDS WERE AGAIN HELD AT THE BALBOA PAVILLION WITH MANY OF THE top skaters, Pros and Amateurs attending. The dress code was semi-formal, which contrary to last years formal requirements, opened up a whole gamut of attire.

Some skaters wore tails and tuxes, like Eddie "El Gato" wearing white tails (fitting) and Mike Ziegfried an outa-sight powder pink tux. So were the bros Hirsch, Steve and Mike both had that prom look.

On the other side of the spectrum, the DEVO, New Wave style had its reps. Duane Peters, Steve Alba, Jay Smith dug up some unreal threads from the 40's or 50's to make their statement. Watching the dress code was just as good of a show. T.A. and Jay Boy, looked a bit more subdued this year, now that many have taken up the style they once set.

In the middle of the dress spectrum were most people, some casual and others wore the standard suit or jacket.

Enough with the threads, let us give you the results of the awards:

BEST INDIVIDUAL AD: The truly ingenious "Fast Relief" ad from KRYPTONICS won the honors. Awarded to the Boulder, Col. based company was Jim Ford.

## BEST ON TIME AD (B & W):

Ken Sherwood from Z-PRODUCTS got the nod and accepted. We can testify to that.

BEST ON TIME AD (Color): This award went to Rich Novak from NHS and to Dawn Domini from TRACKER.

Brian Gilogly, Editor for Skateboarder, presented a "special" award to Publisher Dave Dash, who will soon be turning over his duties to D. David Morin.

By the way, D. David did a fine job of emceeing the entire festivities.

TOTAL INVOLVMENT AWARD: Don Hoffman, Pipeline owner got this award for his efforts to make skateboarding into a sport.

MUSIC TO SKATE BY: was given to the group the DECADENTS. Accepting for the group was their drummer Carbon Dioxide.

DRIVER OF THE YEAR: went to Harvey Hawks, who totaled not one but two Sciroccos during the course of the year. Accepting for Harvey while he recuperates was Kurt Kimble.

## HAIR DRESSER OF THE YEAR:

If Duane Peters ever decides to give up on skating, he'll have a solid future. In the mean time don't go to the bathroom alone with him or he'll lay his Zorro mark on you.

BIGGEST BONGO AWARD: went to Eric Grisham for some of

the nasty falls he's taken during competitions. Most recently at the Big O. The award was given to Eric by who else? BONGO himself.

PROMOTER OF THE YEAR: The award was given to Henry Hester for his efforts in the Hester Series. Henry is not shure whether he'll do it again, but he's listening.

COACH OF THE YEAR: This award could have gone to several people who've spent a lot of time working with their skaters. Fausto, Losi, Dale Smith and others, but Stacy Peralta got the nod for his Brigade.

Once all the "special" awards were given, the movie Skater Dater, circa 1972, was shown. 196 GO FOR IT AMATEURS SHOWED UP AT THE DOG TOWN HOME BASE to do battle for those valued ASPO points.

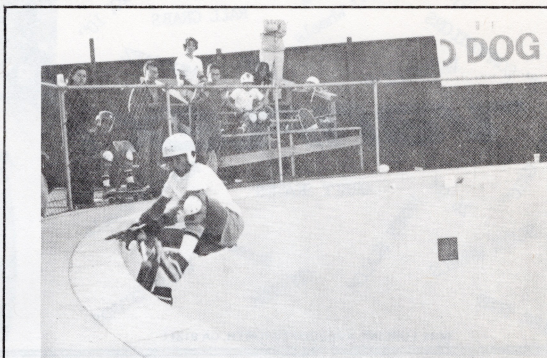
There are four events left in the season, and several cal-ses have a terrific fight going on between the points leaders.

The Park Team Class, 10& under is lead by Robbie Wagener (SkaterCross) by only 10 pts. ahead of Tommy Finch(Colton)

The 11-12 Park Team class has Les Pearlman (SkaterCross) with 1018 pts. only 8 points ahead of Big O skater Jeff Sewell, with 1010. Doug Cobalis (Colton) is not too far behind with 960pts. Colton is the last event of the season. Watch out for Doug.

Park Team 13-14 class is lead by the older Cobalis, Roland. His 1115 pts. are only 64 pts. ahead of second place skater Brian Hinson(Big O).

The 15-17 is super close. Eddie Meek(Big O) leads with 1096 pts, only 3 points ahead of second place skater from Skate City, Lance Mountain with 1093. In 3rd with 1000 points is Scott Fraley(Pipeline). Scott may have the advantage going into the fi-

nal four events of the season since two events are at his local parks, Pipeline & Colton.

The Park Open class has Todd Smoke(Big O) leading with 1071 pts. 39 pts. behind with his home park still to come is Rusty St. Cyr with 1032.

In the Un-sponsored 10 & Und. class, Lonnie Peralta, for the first time this season, relinquished his 1st place to Doug Graham from Clairmont. Doug has 751 pts. to Lonnie's 740. Lonnie did

miss two events in a row, but is set to do battle in the last four contests.

Chris Miller(Clairmont) has a semi-comfortable lead

in the 11-12 Unsp. class. His 1145 pts. are just ahead of Brian Treanor(Woodland Hill) 923 and Jeremy Fletcher (Van Nuys) 908.

Three skaters have dominated the 13-14 class. Leading so far is Darren Price(N.Holly) with 1053. Just behind is Mark Takahashi(Canoga Pk.) with 1025 and Tom Michaels (Arleta) with 1013. All three VAL skaters skate at Skater-Cross, which helps to keep a good eye on each others progress. The battle is hot and heavy.

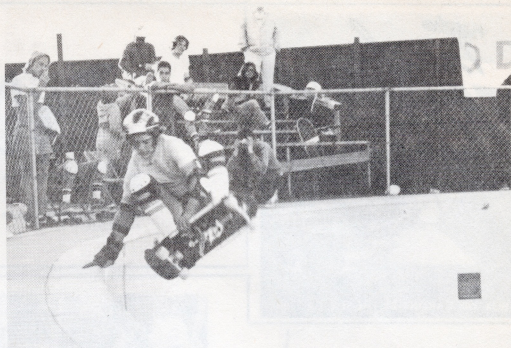

The Unsp. Open class is lead by Kent Douglas with 1136, 300 plus points ahead of Jame Murphy.

Other battles which could change in the next event at OASIS ARE:

Men Rollerskaters, Paul Votava(SkaterCross) 960 pts. and Bobby Chase(SkaterCross) with 760 pts. are followed close by John Tassi(Hamels) with 737 pts. The Oasis event and the Del Mar event coming up should be a definite advantage for John to catch up.

As you can see the next four events; OASIS, DEL MAR, PIPELINE & COLTON, will feature some outstanding competitions among some of these skaters.

You should try to make every event, because these guys are, all of a sudden, very serious. The stakes are high.

Besides the "Gold Crads" being awarded at the end of the season, there will be some out-
