HESTER PRO-AM/PIPELINE FINALS -PREVIEW

ON SEPTEMBER 22-23 the Final HESTER will be held at the Pipeline, in their 'hew' square and round pools, recently built to Don Hoffman's designs.

These two pools will offer a strong challenge to both PROS and AMATEURS alike.

AMATEUR competitions will start approximately at 9 am. on both Saturday and Sunday.

PRO competition will start approximately 5pm evening.

Based on the current heat-wave and 100 degree plus temperatures, this news may be a welcome relief to many PROS.

Mathematically, there appears to be only two skaters who qualify for the "overall" lst place in the Series. They are Mickey Alba, currently going into the HESTER with 305 pts. and Eddie Elguera with 260 p.

PSA has announced the rescheduling of the starting date for the PRO "CIRCUIT".

"CIRCUIT" competition will start on November 15,1979.

Lou Peralta, organizer of the "CIRCUIT" sites various reasons for the postponement.

Many PRO and "would be PRO" skaters have been on vacation and have not received any information about the program.

"We're also working on a new Judging system for Pool, Bowl Half-Pipe & Pipe competition that needs to be reviewed by many of the current PROS and experts," stated Peralta.

The system will simplify and make judging more accurate and "we don't want to start the season with one system and then have to switch".

Also, Peralta states, 'many of the CIRCUIT Sponsors have been away in sales trips and vacations. They too need to be brought up to date as to what the 'CIRCUIT' is all about.

The PSA is also working in obtaining a commitment from outside media to cover all of the events or at least carry the results and standings on a weekly basis.

In line for commitments are the L.A Times, Herald Examiner, Long Beach Press and several other key newspapers. Also, there's a good possibility that most of the local TV Stations may carry results on a semi-regular basis.

"All this has taken more time than anticipated", says Lou, "but it is worth it if we can get it. We want to go into the season, with the best possible program for PROS and Spectators alike.


A letter has also gone out to many manufacturers, indicating a revision of the amount for Sponsorship of the CIRCU-IT. The original sum of \$2,000. per Sponsor for the PRO-FUND, has been reduced to \$1,000.

"In doing this", Peralta states, "we will make it easier on many companies that wanted to become Sponsors of the CIRCUIT, but could not commit to the original sum, the opportunity to participate in the program."

PSA is currently working on an out-side sponsor to put up cash for the PROS.

Their goal is to have between \$10,000. and \$15,000. in the POINIS FUND from within the Industry and maybe sweeten the pot to \$20,000.-\$25,000. from an "out-side" Sponsor.

This paper will keep you posted of all developments as well as, the schedule of all dates and events in the "CIRCUIT".

These two skaters have been in the winners circle all summer long and since the PIPELINE is close to their homes, they are the odds-on favorite to take the big cash prize.

First place will again be worth \$1,000.; Second, \$500. Third, \$250.; Fourth \$125. Fifth, \$100.; Sixth \$75.; and Seventh, \$25.

The Doubles competition, now proving very exciting and popular, has been given a boost in prize money, with First being worth \$500.; Second,\$300. and Third \$100.

Unfortunately, we weren't able to reach all of them but here's what some had to say about the Final and about the Series itself:

MIKE ALBA KRYPTONICS Montclair, Ca.

Mike is currently in first place as far as point standings.(305...Elguera; in 2nd, w/ 260) All in all,

Mike feels the Series was a good one, but felt it could have been organized better. He also felt that Hester should go to other sponsors for more money, such as Coca-Cola, instead of depending on his own funds. Mike's expectations for this upcoming contest are good. however, he feels that quite a few guys will probably get hurt in Upland's gnarly 12' pool. Still, we think Mike's chances are pretty good. When asked what he would do with the money if he should win, Mike replied, "I'll put it in the bank and save it". 'What for?' ... What else: "a car when I get older!" Mike, of course, has been practising, and he is looking forward to the bowlriding. He says he's not really into doubles, but will probably enter anyways...although he's not yet sure who his partner will be. Mike's looking forward to the end of the Series, but plans to enter any other contests that may come along.

This isn't bad, considering that Eric turned PRO just recently, for the Boulder event.

Eric hopes to place first in the "doubles" (He and Steve Hirsch won the event at Whittier) and somewhere first or fourth in the Pipeline Pools, and lots of \$\$\$\$\$!

He also feels that, his efforts in the coming contest will place him pretty well up there in his total point standings for the Series.

Eric's feelings toward the Series in general?...Well, he thinks "they could have been organized a little better and there should be more money involved, say, \$3,000. for first place?"...Not bad!

As far as practicing goes, Eric's been skating Upland about 3 times a week and hopes to spend the week before the contest at the Alba's residence and practice every day.

What will Eric do with his prize money, should he win? "well it depends on how much I get, but I'll probably spend most of it on my girlfriend". Grisham is realy looking forward to the "doubles" event, in which he'll pair-up again with team mate Steve Hirsch. They won the Whittier "doubles" with an outrageous routine.

Not a bad deal to win, since Steve's still an Amateur he won't have to split the prize money.(unless Steve decides to turn PRO).

Eric's sorry to see the end of the Series, but will go on to compete in the PSA "Circuit" soon to start.

Peter is greeting the end of the HESTER Series with a feeling of relief. "personally, there's alot of pressures involved in competiting...also it's a good chance to get back to the drawing board and learn some new tricks".

He'd also like to relax more and keep skating. Hopefully, he won't have to get a "real job" in the near future.



Allen Losi, San Bernardino's local ripper skates for VARI-FLEX Amateur Team. His board is a George Orton model, with Connection Truck, C-3 wheels, VARIFLEX wrist guards, RECTOR pads and worn out Nikes.

Al's been serious about skating for about a year.

He has competed in at least 20 major amateur events, including all USASA events.

Most recently, Allen placed 1st. in the 11-14 division at OASIS Classic and 1st at the MARINA's/VANS All American events. 3rd at Del Mar's Pool competition.

He likes pool riding although he used to freestyle alot. He'd like to get back to it.

Allen would like to turn PRO by the time he's 16, if not before and follow in the foot steps of fellow team-skater. Eric Grisham

Allen feels Eric is "an all around nice guy...plus he shredds!".

Al specializes in 'Ollieair", although he's got the basics wired

How do his parents feel about his skating?

Well considering that Gil Losi Sr. is owner with brother Ray Losi of VARIFLEX and Coach of the team, and mother Jannet is manager of the Colton Ranch, they like it just fine and encourage him.

In fact, mom and dad can be seen on the sidelines at most events

Allen says he's got no other hobbies except skating, which he does all the time. However, he did mention something about girls.

Although Allen is confident about his skating, he too has had his share of injuries.

He has pulled ligaments and bruised ribs three times. He also suffers from water in the knees, plus the fact that he falls alot.

"It's all part of the game. If you're going to be good, you've gotta pay the price".

After all, if he can place 1st. at OASIS with a pulled ligament, it shows the kind of fortitude and determination it takes to be a winner.

With Amateurs like Allen Losi around, we have nothing to worry about the future crop of pro-skateboarders.
