

THE FIRST CIRCUIT CONTEST WAS HELD ON MAY 3 AT APPLE SKATEPARK IN Colombus, Ohio.

The judging system used was based on 100 points possible per 45sec. run.

Selecting the best of the two runs from a possible 90 points from each judge, was the criteria. All scores were added and then averaged. There was also a possible ten points awarded by tricks recorded per run. The combined total was then the skaters' official score.

Skaters who had planned routines and performed them as planned, usually took the higher scores.

Those who performed spontaneous routines could only score up to 5 points.

The Michigan crowd made a strong showing as far as the turnout went. Hopefully, ASTRO Skatepark will draw the Indiana, Illinois and Wisconsin crowd.

The ASTRO GLSA is planned for May 31 and will be held in the keyhole. The \$5.00 entry will allow all entrants to compete and skate all day.

The Rollerskating class was small for this contest, but showed great potential and energy.

Judges, Chris Yandall, Ron Dudley and Dave Andrecht and recorder Kevin Tate did an excellent job..

A special thanks to SIMS for Andrecht and Terrebonne for their presence.

And thanks to Gene Goldberg, owner of the APPLE SKATEPARK for putting on a great show.



PRO GOLD CUP SERIES...A REALITY

MAY 8,1980- ANAHEIM

FOR THE FIRST TIME SINCE WE CAN REMEMBER, A SIZEABLE number of industry representatives attended the PRO SERIES meeting.

It then appeared that with that kind of support, this new PRO GOLD CUP SERIES has the chance to become reality this summer.

Attending the meeting, which was held at VANS headquarters in Anaheim, were the following industry members: Don Hoffman, Pipeline; Mrs. Hoffman; Barrie Lynn, representing SIMS; Gil & Janet Losi representing VARIFLEX and the COLTON Skateranch; Ray Losi, VARIFLEX; Dan Osterberg, SKATE CITY; Stacy Peralta, POWELL/PERALTA; Fausto Vittialo, NHS/INDY; Dennis Ogden, MARINA; David Morin, SKATEBOARDER; Lou. Peralta, SKAT'N NEWS/WALL-PRO/SKATERCROSS/ASPO; John Silver, OASIS Skatepark; Ray Allen, "RAY ALLEN SHOW"; Jerry Hurtado, BIG O; Curtis Hesselgrave, RAX; Lance Smith TRACKER; Steve Cathey, G & S;



Everett Roscrans, VANS; Wayne Searle, DEL MAR Skateranch; Ozzie Oswald, ESCON-DIDO Skatepark.

The series is set to start on June 21-22 at the OASIS Skatepark and it will be billed as the G & S PRO GOLD CUP # 1.

Thereafter the tentative schedule is as follows:
July 19-20 SIMS GOLD CUP at
BIG 0; August 30-31, VARIFLEX GOLD CUP at Colton;
SEPTEMBER 27-28, POWELL
GOLD CUP at MARINA and the
final or championship
will be at PIPELINE on Nov.
1-2, 1980.

The series is limited to POOL competition with the look to the future to expand it to all types of skateboarding competitions.

The intent is to launch one successful first-class series and progress from there to other programs. To show how strong most of the industry feels about this program, four major sponsors of the series, (VARIFLEX, POWELL/PERALTA, G & S and SIMS) brought their \$3,000 checks with them as their commitment to this series.

The program is now funded and it's anticipated that the PRO Purse will total approximately \$ 28,000!

Many other sponsors will be contributing either \$500. to \$1,000. for the circuit.

All sponsors of the series will have their banner(s) displayed at every event.

To carry out this entire program a "board of directors" has been elected, they are: Steve Cathey, representing G & S; Gil Losi, VARIFLEX; Paul Sims, SIMS; Stacy Peralta, POWELL/PE-RALTA; Dave Andrecht, representing the Pro skaters; Lou Peralta and Terry Wolf, representing the Parks; D. David Morin, Skateboarder; and Don Hoffman, Director of Competition.

These gentlemen will make all the major decisions reguarding the Series and in

addition, some will also



ASPO '80... A PROGRESSIVE CHANGE FOR THE FUTURE.

THEY SAY THAT SUCCESS BREEDS success. Truer words were never spoken.

The great success that the ASPO AMATEUR CIRCUIT has experienced this past six months, has encouraged and set a format for other people take the lead.

As a result, FAST(Florida) and GLSA(Notheastern) amateur circuits are now on full on competition schedules.

In order to maintain success, changes have to be made to insure that it continues.

Thus, ASPO, in their last meeting, set the course for next season's program.

There are changes which will make the running of the league more proficient, safer, and more equal. For example, plans are now to put all results after each competition into a computer system, for fast and accurate score keeping.

Therefore, it will be nescessasy to assign each and every skater that joins the ASPO league a membership number which will also be his "COMPETITION" number.

A racing bib will be issued and it shall be the responsibility of each skater to be sure to bring it and use it in every ASPO event.

In order to skate in any ASPO event, a skater will be required to purchase an ASPO competition membership. The membership will cost a one time-season fee of \$10. and it will include an ASPO card(note: any skater with a valid ASPO card will get a 50¢ discount off thier sessions at any ASPO park), ASPO sticker, racing bib and liability and Medical insurance for any ASPO event.

In addition, any ASPO member will receive a discount

on a SKAT'N NEWS subscription.

This coming season promisses to be bigger than ever.

Many skaters that got into the circuit late this past season or felt that it was too late to start, will be waiting for this next season to get on its way.

There's also a change made in the age groups and classes for the sake of more even competitions.

Here are the classes and age groups:

UNSPONSORED CLASSES age groupings are 12% Under, 13-14, 15-17 and Open. This class will have a 1A and 2A division. The latter being the skaters with the better ability.

SPONSORED CLASS is the 3A class, the age divisions are the same as the Unsponsored class and the PARK TEAM classes.

ROLLER SKATING MEN will be an OPEN class with a 1A & 2A division.

ROLLER SKATE WOMEN is an Open class.

GIRLS SKATEBOARDERS will remain the same, 13 & under, 14-16 and Open.

These changes were made as a result of some of the experiences learned this past season. This way, ASPO feels that the rating will make the skating more equal.

As it stands now, those skaters that competed last ASPO season will be automatically rated by a committee formed of skatepark owners/representatives who have seen most of the skaters.

Most likely, the top skaters in each class and age group may wind up in the 2A, umless they receive sponsorship, which automatically puts them into a 3A class.

The 1A rating may be only temporary, as a formula is devised, so that anyone that amasses more than 300 points in any four events (two meets) moves immediately into a 2A grouping.

This is done to prevent anyone from "sand-bagging" or holding back to earn top points.

The way the system is designed is so that each skater has the opportunity to grow in the sport and compete at his own level.

The progression from a 1A skater to 2A, 3A(sponsored) will lead to the ability to turn Professional.

While there are no set rules at this time, limiting anyone from turning Pro, it is anticipated that following the current PRO GOLD CUP SERIES, no one will be able to skate as a PRO unless they have come up the ASPO ranks or a similar organized competition program.

In other words, no 1A or

2A skater can turn Pro, he or she must come out of the 3A class.

This sets the ground work for a National program, which is hoped to go into effect in 1981.

ASPO has also devised a system to encourage all skatters to move up in classes.

For example, this next season, GOLD CARDS will be issued, but in this manner: 1A skaters, 1st place will receive a 3-month GOLD CARD and 2nd. place will receive a 2-month GOLD CARD.

On the other hand, the 2A divisions will receive the following: 1st. 6-months GOLD CARD; 2nd. 5-months; 3rd. 4-month and 4th 3-mo. GOLD CARD.
